Injunction stops tenant threats to Shoreline employees

A Shoreline tenant who threatened and harassed local housing employees has been hit with an anti-social behaviour injunction.

Mr Kelvin Evison, 59 of Windsor Road was repeatedly hostile to Shoreline employees both at his home and over the telephone.

Mr Evison also refused access to carry out essential inspections including a fire safety check by the Humberside Fire and Rescue Service.

Eight Shoreline employees were involved in the injunction proceedings reporting incidents in which Evison threatened violence against them and their families.

The prosecution also cited ten other previously recorded incidents involving threats to North East Lincolnshire Council employees prior to the stock transfer of properties to the housing association.

The two year injunction, secured at Grimsby Combined Court forbids Evison from assaulting, threatening to assault, harass or use abusive or threatening language against Shoreline employees, partnering agents or contractors and requires him to provide necessary access to the property.

Evison will be arrested if he breaks the first of these conditions.

Shoreline enforcement manager Jim Broadbent said: "We will use all the powers available to us to protect our employees, partner agents and contractors.

"This sends a clear message that we will not tolerate this sort of behaviour and we will do everything we can to provide a safe environment for our employees to work in as well as protect our tenants and our properties."
